Director's Note

Good evening ACU Theatre friends & patrons,

I am delighted that you have chosen to spend an evening with us at ACU Theatre. Tonight, you will see the culmination of six weeks of production build and rehearsal. Our students have poured out their hearts through Victorian research, period style etiquette, design creativity and trust in the process of demanding text translated to the stage.

This has been one of the most challenging and rewarding productions of my humble career as a director. In my research, Ibsen is quoted in stating he did not set out to write a female empowerment play but rather a play about a human problem. I believe both themes are intertwined.

These seven extraordinary BFA actors have stepped in bravely. We agreed that each of these characters are seeking love out of desperation; all through what they believe to be pure motive. In A Doll's House, you will observe broken people clinging to diminished hopes and prayers. You will observe characters striving to find love through justified and contorted measures. You will observe characters questioning belief systems, seeking justice and longing for foundation. Fear drives and yet, in the end, I believe this play provides room for the breath of hope and transformation for good.

Hendrik Ibsen went to work on penning this rich classic in 1878 after meeting a young Norwegian woman that he took a fancy to and adopted the name 'skylark'. That woman married a schoolmaster that fell ill. The woman arranged a loan without his knowledge and later she was accused of forgery even though she had worked hard for the loan. Her intentions were pure, but she was criminalized.


ACU Theatre's season theme for 2025 is Winds of Change. I find the title fitting and in Ibsen's brilliance, he leaves the audience to guess the future. The power of theatre is that it invites us each an opportunity to see ourselves or a truth that we better recognize. I ask that you stay with the play through all 3 acts...only then will you experience the full arc of story.

May we strive to be a people that love generously. May we never stop believing and trusting that in a world that needs a flicker, only Jesus can bring that change...never lose hope. That is a glorious thing.


