The Program defines *Student Achievement* as: 1) 70% of students in each cohort will graduate in the advertised length of time; 2) 100% of students will maintain membership in the AAMFT during the entire length of the program; and, 3) 70% of students will earn minimum scores of 3 on the Capstone Paper and Presentation.

Graduation Rate (after beginning Foundational Application Component)

Pass rate for respondents on the AMFTRB Exam

74% of respondents to the 2022 Annual Graduate Achievement Survey passed the exam. $n=27$

Working as MFTs

81% of respondents to the Annual Graduate Achievement Survey are employed as an MFT.

Licensed as MFT
